## INCUBATOR VISIT TO THE CARDIOLOGY AND RADIATION THERAPY DEPARTMENTS



Fifteen Year 12 and 13 students travelled to Dunedin Public Hospital after school last term. They visited the Vascular Lab and the Oncology departments. One of the important messages students get through this programme is the need to honour the confidentiality and privacy of what they see, so we feel very privileged to have the experiences we do.

Students found out about the placement of pacemakers, the heart and its function, tools used in the diagnosis of cardiac problems, and saw images of healthy and less functional hearts on the ultra sound machine. They heard from two cardiac physiologists about their work and training, and were lucky enough to observe two stents being placed in patients' hearts, while the Cardiology Consultants explained the procedures. Students then met a Radiation Therapist who explained her work, and what is involved in the training and the provision of Radiation Therapy.



Students learnt about the information that must be gathered to ensure the radiation treatment is correct and correctly directed, and that no other tissue is unintentionally damaged by the treatment. They were shown the Linear Accelerator and the room used for treatment. Students also saw the materials used to create frames to hold the patient in the correct position for treatment each time, as accuracy of treatment is very important. Radiation Therapists

must also be empathetic and good 'people people' so they can provide emotional support to the patients. Once again, this was a fascinating and valuable visit. Thanks to Vicie Hodge from SDHB for planning the programme for us.

## YEAR 13 DUATHLON

Last term Year 13 PE completed their Duathlon assessment. This achievement standard involves students racing the clock to gain 4 credits, based on their time in a 5km run and 10 Km bike. This year we saw a very fit group of students achieve some great results, with 3 excellence, 4 merit and 3 achieved passes. Congratulations to Judah Kelly who was 1<sup>st</sup> and completed the course in the fastest time on record over the last 5 years.

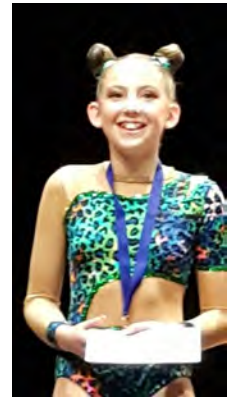
